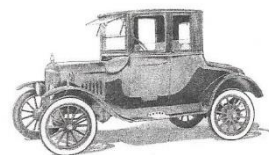

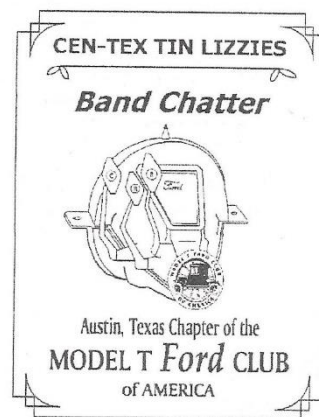

We missed the Kingsbury Fly-in due to my father's funeral. I was lucky to have my dad around for as long as I did. He died on the morning of his 95th birthday.

My dad introduced me to old cars at the age of 5. A machinist by trade, he was hired to make some parts for a 1908 Buick. The owner of the car (Bill) became good friends with my dad and upon its completion we were invited to a cook-out at Bills place and a chance to ride in the Buick. It was the most beautiful thing I had ever seen, a white body with lots of gleaming brass and a 5 year old kid was not only bitten but swallowed up by the old car bug and I have been car crazy ever since.

Over the years, dad and I had a great relationship usually surrounded by old cars (and a few old buildings). Together we owned a 1912 Cartercar 7 pass, 1922 Cadillac phaeton 7 pass, numerous model T's, and early 1930's Chevrolets, 1927 Pontiac, 1929 Oldsmobile, just to name a few. We attended swap meets together for over 45 years and I could always call on him for his opinion and advice.

Never being one who cared to operate the cars he was content to sit back and enjoy the ride as I got the thrill of driving them. He once told me that it was the "pride of ownership" that gave him the greatest satisfaction, even if a car was not finished or road ready.

My parents had been married for 66 years when my mother passed away 10 years ago, now I expect they are reunited and traveling around together in an old car.

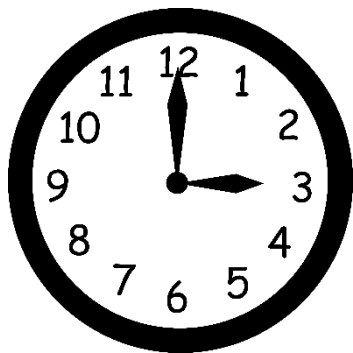

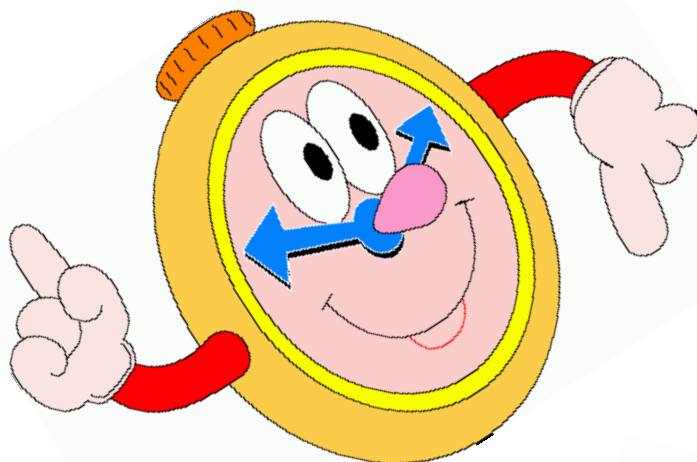
