

## Secretary's Report

**Dues:** Wording will be added to clarify that membership dues are for a family.

**Board of Directors:** Regular monthly meetings may coincide with board meetings. This is to fulfill the "board needs to meet 6 times a year" requirement.

**Notification to National Club:** *In January each year the Secretary will notify MTFCA with our Board Members and with our chapter members that also belong to MTFCA.* 

We should have 50% or more of our chapter members in the MTFCA.

Glen will write up an amendment to the bylaws of the above changes.

After the changes were reviewed and discussed Joe moved that we accept the changes and Gary provided a second. The group voted to approve the changes to the bylaws.

Glen asked Bob to have the newsletter updated to reflect the bylaws changes just approved, the board member's names have changed. If the bylaws are on the website, they would need to be updated as well.

**Adjournment:** Randy made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bob and George both seconded the motion.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:40 PM.




1914 Ford Model T Speedster

"Tuesday," the second man replies without hesitation.


Shaking his head in disbelief, the doctor turns to the third man.

A Rare 1912 Ford Model T Torpedo Roadster Convertible




### **Automotive Firsts**


### **Speedometer**

Time to explode a myth: the Ford Model T was not the world's first mass-produced car. It was the world's first mass-produced car to sell in really big numbers, but it was the Curved Dash Oldsmobile that was the first car to be built using mass-production techniques. However, just 19,000 or so examples were made between 1901 and 1907, whereas more than 16.5 million Model Ts were made between 1908 and 1927.

This Olds was also the first production car to get a speedometer.


